A full access rating guarantees a fully autonomous experience for most people with reduced mobility.



A partial access rating means that the establishment meets all major criteria for accessibility, but still presents certain obstacles.



A not accessible rating means that visitors will run into several obstacles (doorsteps, low steps, stairs, etc.).

Services are provided for people with various levels of hearing impairment (ex.: audio guides).



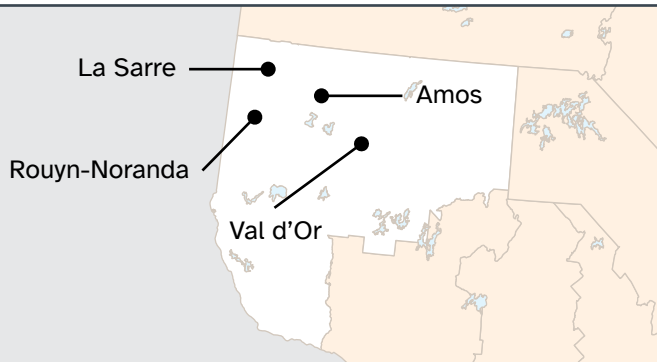

The magnificent landscapes of this region await you. The accessible La Castorière trail invites you to explore 760 metres of beaver habitat.

This picnic stop in the heart of the forest features an exhibition on what is involved in collecting water from an esker.

La Corne Nursing Station National Historic Site of Canada • La Corne

Learn about the work that nurses did over the years at this nursing station built between 1932 and 1975. 🦉

Musée minéralogique de l'Abitibi-Témiscamingue • Malartic

After learning about the local geology, minerals and mining projects, explore the Canadian Malartic pit, the largest open-pit gold mine in the country still in operation. 🦉

MA, musée d'art de Rouyn-Noranda •

Rouyn-Noranda

This museum contributes to the development of the arts in Québec, Canada and the Americas and offers a collective Indigenous perspective to the continent.

Musée de la poste et Boutique de forge, Parc Héritage • Saint-Marc-de-Figuery

Take yourself back to 1920 and learn about the important roles played by the postmaster and the blacksmith in the parish's development in those days.

Le Rift - Salle Augustin-Chénier • Ville-Marie

This cultural venue offers an extensive annual program of comedy shows, concerts, theatre and cinema, as well as art and historical exhibitions, including the International Miniature Art Biennial.

The very first urban-style house in the region, it offers visitors an immersive experience of the days when Abitibi was first settled.



Vieux Palais, Palais des arts Harricana • Amos

This former courthouse is now a centre dedicated to the visual arts and the region's history.


Centre d'interprétation de la foresterie • La Sarre

Immerse yourself in the region's history through a look at its forest industry, geography and archaeology. Take your time looking at the artefacts and interactive exhibits.

Première-Chute Hydroelectric Generating Station (Hydro-Québec) • Notre-Dame-du-Nord

Learn about a uniquely designed power generating station, the history of electrification of the region and the process of power generation.

Discover the fascinating world of fossils and how fossilization takes place through an extensive collection from every continent.

Fromagerie Fromabitibi • Macamic

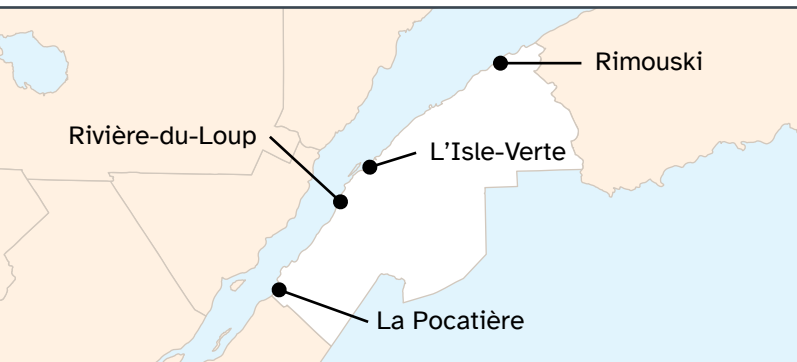

Bas-Saint-Laurent



With the Route des Navigateurs and the Route des Frontières running through it, this region brings treasure islands to mind, with century-old lighthouses and sunsets that will charm all those who love fresh, salt-scented air.

Trail along the shoreline of the Rimouski River •

Rimouski

This accessible trail runs along a salt marsh. From Rocher Blanc beach, on a clear day you can see the Côte-Nord only 50 km away.

Parc national du Lac-Témiscouata •

Saint-Michel-du-Squatec

Local fauna and nature await you in this provincial park. The small Jardin des Mémoires trail is accessible, as is the beach, with its adapted picnic tables.

Sentier Rivière-du-Loup – Témiscouata •

Saint-Modeste

This 70-km section of the compacted stone dust bike path in the Petit Témis Interprovincial Linear Park criss-crosses rivers and forests. Includes several stops where you can enjoy a light meal.

Terfa - Hell's Gate Canyon •

Saint-Narcisse-de-Rimouski

Québec's highest suspended footbridge is 63 metres high and is accessible by drivable road. Unique panoramic view, short, magical interactive trails, interpretation and historical reconstructions.

Partially Accessible

Parc Beauséjour • Rimouski

This small urban park has adapted picnic tables and a barrier-free trail.

Parc national du Bic • Rimouski

This park with its coves and bays offers an ideal vantage point for watching the sun go down.

The Chemin-du-Nord is an accessible trail along the coastline.

Parc des Chutes et de la Croix • Rivière-du-Loup

A path with a fairly steep slope leads to a spot where you'll be able look at the falls.

Promenade de l'Anse-aux-Coques • Sainte-Luce

This stroll along the beach offers a different, often stunning, scenic view every day, depending on the wind and tides.

Centre culturel Georges-Deschênes • Dégelis

This former parish hall, named in honour of one of its mayors, has been transformed into a show and film venue, accessible to all.

Maison touristique régionale du Bas-Saint-Laurent • La Pocatière

See an interactive exhibit on the bounty of the Grande-Anse salt marsh and its biodiversity as well as a 360-degree video on Kamouraska.

Sanctuaire Sainte-Anne-de-la-Pointe-au-Père • Rimouski

Superb sanctuary both indoors and out with its park and statues.

Site historique maritime de la Pointe-au-Père • Rimouski

Visit the old buildings at the lighthouse station and the Empress of Ireland museum, which features an immersive exhibit on the history of this steamship and the horrific day it sank. The submarine located right next to it is partially accessible.

La Vieille Gare de Rivière-Bleue • Rivière-Bleue

The only preserved train station in the entire region. Immerse yourself in the Transcontinental adventure through interpretive panels, stories and period objects.

Chapelle du Quai • Rivière-Ouelle

Take a break at the Café de la Chapelle and visit the lovely pier just steps from the chapel.

Musée du Témiscouata • Témiscouata-sur-le-Lac

This museum preserves and displays ethnographic and documentary collections on the colonial history of Témiscouata.

Fort Ingall • Témiscouata-sur-le-Lac

Authentic reconstruction of the British fortress erected in 1839 during a border dispute between the United States and Canada.

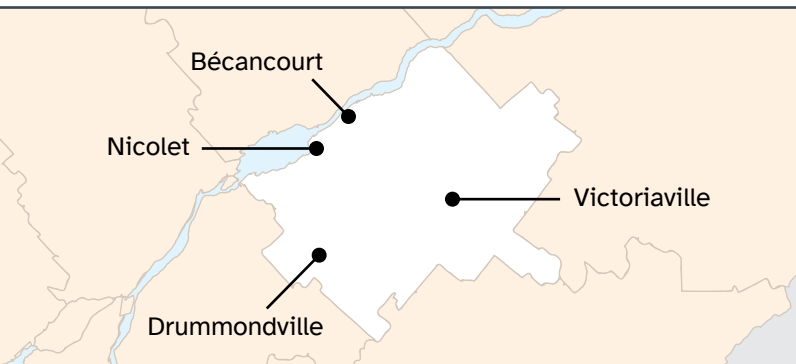

Stretching from the St. Lawrence River to the foothills of the Appalachians, this region comes alive with a rich cultural life. This land of maple trees and cranberries will enchant epicureans.

Parks and Outdoors

Accessible

Parc Marie-Victorin • Kingsey Falls

Visit this botanical garden where astonishing giant mosaiculture sculptures rise up in six fantastic gardens and a tropical greenhouse.  

Parc régional des Grandes-Coulées – Old-growth forest area • Plessisville

Wind your way through the old-growth forest on the Des Pins trail (4 km out and back) or follow the Rivière Noire on the De la Tortue trail (4.4 km out and back). Flat trails with rest areas.

Parc régional de la Rivière Gentilly •

Sainte-Marie-de-Blandford

Surrounded by forest, hike the 1.3-km unobstructed loop trail, which includes various rest areas.

Parc du Réservoir Beaudet • Victoriaville

Wander the accessible trails or take an adapted kayak to see the birds during the fall migration season.

Terre-des-Jeunes Park • Victoriaville

This park is one of the largest green spaces in the city. A pleasant place for a moment of relaxation in a lush woodland that the Nicolet River flows through.

Stroll through this park and contemplate the surrounding natural areas.

Parc du Mont Arthabaska – Maison recyclée des artisans du rebut global • Victoriaville

Close to downtown, this park offers a variety of free activities: trails, snow tubing, birdwatching and concerts at the lookout.

Parc du Mont Arthabaska - Service pavilion •

Victoriaville


Take in the stunning view from the lookout at the top of the mountain. The pavilion features an accessible bistro-bar on the ground floor and patio, as well as a large performance hall.

Take the woodland trails to learn more about the local ecosystems, and visit the museum to get acquainted with Québec wildlife, past and present.


Musée des cultures du monde • Nicolet

The only museum in the Americas dedicated to the five great religions of the world, it presents exhibitions and activities to promote learning, knowledge and exploration.

Cinéma Galaxy • Victoriaville

Part of the Cineplex group, this cinema offers a varied repertoire of movies and has reserved seating for people with disabilities, and seating for companions. 

Le Carré 150 • Victoriaville

This complex is Victoriaville's main cultural venue, and comprises a large performance hall, cabaret, studio, art centre and lounge area. Varied programming for all audiences (music, dance, comedy, circus, visual arts, repertory films). 

Musée de l'hotel des Postes • Victoriaville

Located in a Second-Empire style building, this museum dedicated to the mail exhibits artefacts and presents a replica of an old post office.

Théâtre Parminou • Victoriaville

This socially engaged, creative and touring popular theatre cooperative is celebrating its 50th anniversary. Discover its new cabaret-theatre formula in 2024.

Victoriaville, Destination for All

This municipality offers an accessible, varied and quality tourist experience, enabling people with special needs to stay for several days. Tourists can sleep, eat, visit, shop and enjoy a range of daily activities in a barrier-free environment and a culture of hospitality excellence.

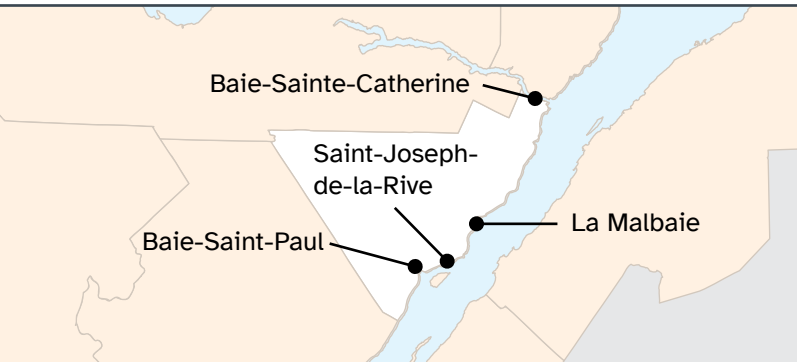

A fascinating experience at the relaxing pace of the windmill and watermill era, brought together in a unique heritage site in America. 

Les Traverseux: Espace patrimoine – Canot à glace • Isle-aux-Coudres

Immerse yourself in the maritime history of the St. Lawrence islands and discover how the ice canoe, once an instrument of necessity, has evolved into a form of competitive sport. Watch as brave canoers set out onto the icy river.

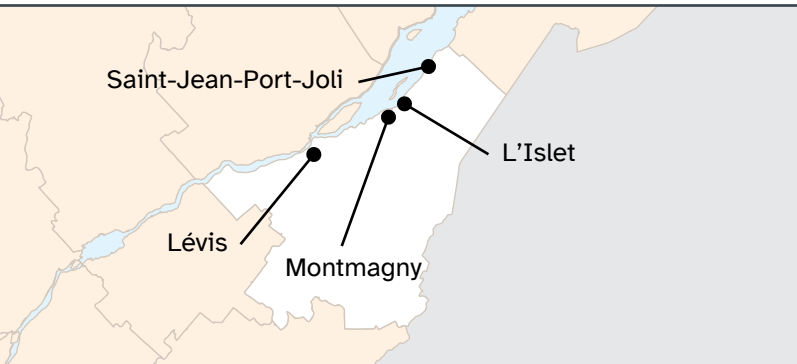

This museum houses one of Canada's most extensive collections of maritime heritage, with over 15,000 artefacts, maps, books and old documents.  

Maison natale de Louis Fréchette • Lévis
This heritage and historic house is a literary and cultural centre. Activities, exhibits and events are held throughout the year.

Ovascène / Salle Méchatigan • Sainte-Marie
Make the most of this cultural venue and its wide array of concerts, comedy shows, theatre and storytelling. General public, children and families.

Minéro - Musée Thetford | KB3 • Thetford Mines
This museum recalls the mining history of the Appalachian region through collections and exhibits related to geology and earth sciences.

Notre-Dame-des-Pins
The site of this miniature village is a natural setting where you can meander among the 200 models created by Ernest Baillargeon.

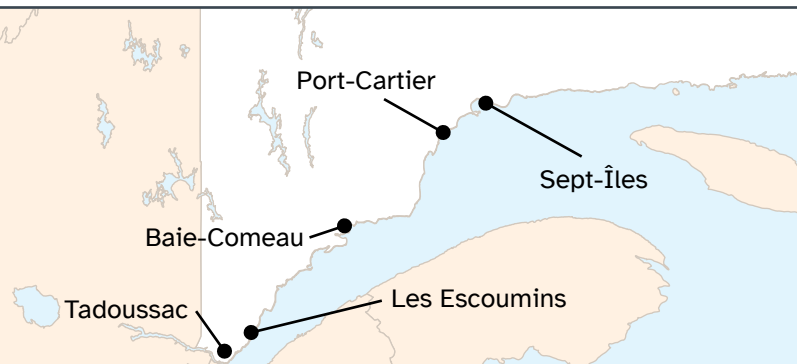

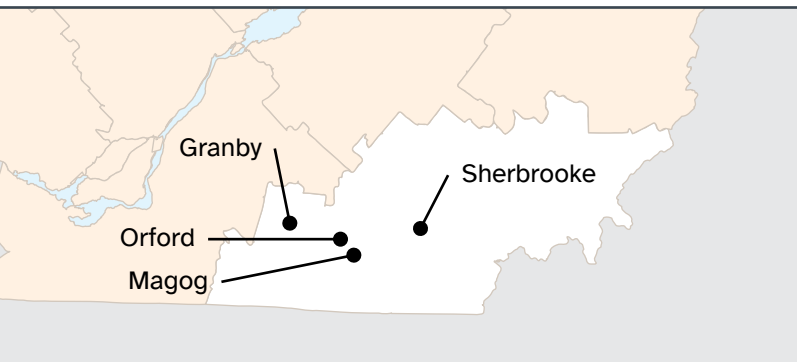

Eastern Townships

Les Amis des Sentiers de Bromont – Parc des Sommets (Mont Oak) • Bromont

You'll find plenty of easy-to-intermediate trails in this area. After you make your reservation, you can rent an adapted electric bicycle or a Dahu.

Parc Découverte Nature • Coaticook

Plan a visit to this park and experience pond fishing. The site's indoor activity, Acoatica, is an interactive survival adventure.

Centre d'interprétation de la nature du Lac Boivin • Granby

This peaceful and sustainable conservation area beckons you to discover its fauna and flora or do a bit of birdwatching.

Nestled in the heart of downtown, this Catholic cathedral, inspired by St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and built in the late 19th century, features a nave, a coffered vault, a baldachin with twisted columns and paintings in the transept that are all well worth the visit.

Basilique Notre-Dame de Montréal

The Basilica's history as Montréal's mother church is inseparable from that of the city. The interior decors are nothing short of amazing.

Centre Canadien d'Architecture (CCA)

Dig into some of the world's largest collections of publications, drawings, plans, models, engravings, photographs and the like at this centre of architecture.

World Trade Centre Montréal

This centre, with its modern architecture, connects several historic buildings and a portion of the old "Ruelle des Fortifications." Covered by an impressive glass skylight, it houses a shopping area, a majestic fountain and a portion of the Berlin Wall donated to Montréal for its 350th anniversary.

Centre des arts actuels SKOL

Selected exhibitions in support of emerging art and experimentation in the visual arts. Support service available to all, including neurodivergent people and/or people with intellectual disabilities, and video translated into QSL.


Centre Phi

At the crossroads of art, cinema, music, design and technology, the centre offers a program focused on digital and contemporary arts.

Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel

Discover over three centuries of history in Montréal's oldest stone chapel. See works by Ozias Leduc, miniature ships suspended from the arches and the tomb of Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys.

Château Dufresne

Created from the former residences of the Dufresne brothers, this museum offers exhibitions on heritage and the arts. 

Château Ramezay

This heritage site in Old Montréal recounts the history of the city and the province, from prehistory to the present day.


Écomusée du fier monde

A history museum that offers a look at the day-to-day lives of ordinary people, the Écomusée du fier monde invites visitors to explore little-known aspects of Montréal's culture.

Guido Molinari Foundation

Located in a former bank, this art centre is home to the last studio of Montréal painter and collector Molinari, and exhibits his vast collection of works. Guided tours and workshops for children. 

Fonderie Darling

Housed in two former industrial buildings close to Old Montréal, this visual arts venue features temporary exhibitions, artists' studios and an outdoor public square—an inspiring setting for creativity.

Sir George-Étienne Cartier National Historic Site

Visit the family home of one of the Fathers of Confederation (1814-1873). 


Maison nationale des Patriotes – Prison-des-Patriotes-au-Pied-du-Courant heritage site

Built between 1831 and 1840, this former prison featuring neo-classical architecture now pays tribute to the Patriotes and tells the story of their incarceration within its walls.

Musée de Lachine

Explore a heritage site, a classified archaeological collection, 17th century buildings and a garden with 50 contemporary sculptures.

The Montreal Museum of Fine Arts

Internationally renowned museum with an outstanding contemporary decorative arts collection. 


Musée des Hospitalières de l'Hôtel-Dieu de Montréal

Four centuries of history can be traced through the museum's fascinating collection, which is linked to hospital, medical and pharmaceutical practices, as well as to religious art.

Dorval Museum of Local History and Heritage

This museum combines historical character, innovative multimedia installations and original exhibits on the major events that have shaped Dorval. Discover the former stalls, which are quite rare in Canada.



Parc olympique

View the city from atop the world's tallest inclined tower and get close and personal with the tactile models of the Olympic stadium. 

Pointe-à-Callière

Classified as a national archaeological and historic site, it is the only major archaeological museum in Canada. It covers the Indigenous period to the present day.

Hydro-Québec's head office – Édifice Jean-Lesage

As soon as you enter the lobby, you will be captivated by Jean-Paul Mousseau's mural. Continue your visit in the reception centre with tactile exhibits and virtual tours of the generating stations.  

Société des arts technologiques (SAT)

For digital art and immersive technology enthusiasts, the Satosphere hosts unique artistic creations under its 18-metre dome.

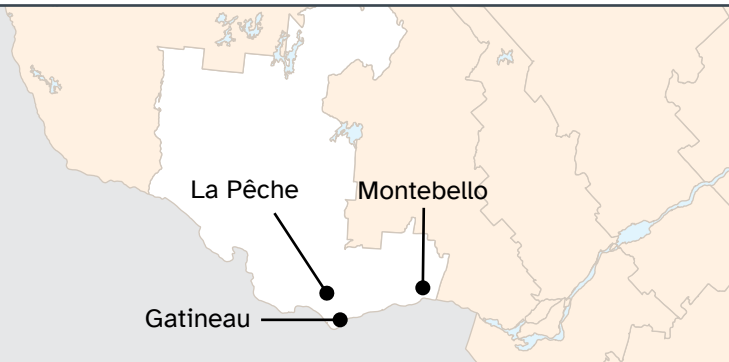

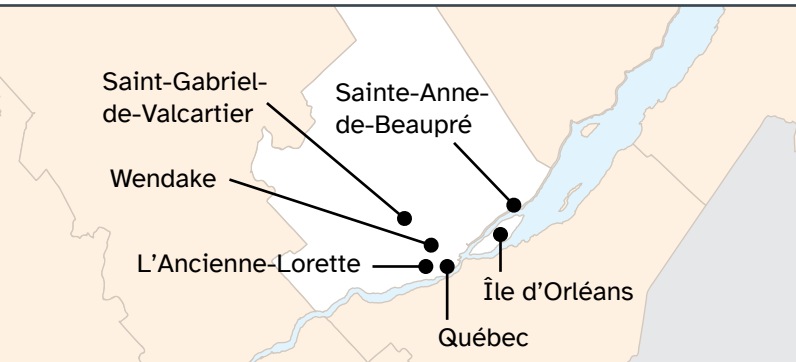

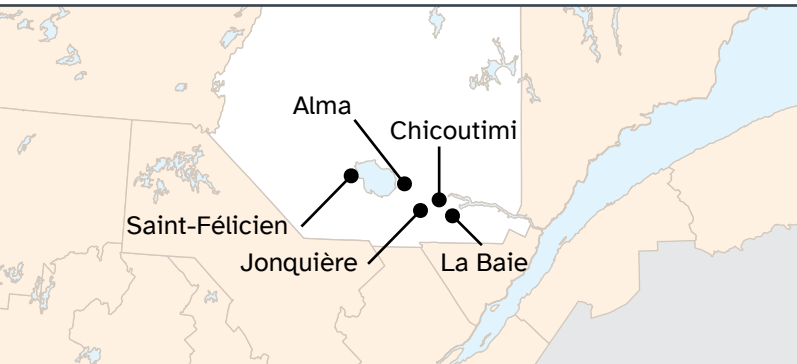

Companion Leisure Card (CAL)—Québec

Transportation

Airports

Montréal-Trudeau International Airport is dedicated to making accessible all its facilities. The international arrivals hall of the Montréal-Trudeau airport features an adapted hygiene room where you can freshen up. These facilities are equipped with a lift and changing station for adults. To travel to and from the airport, the 747 shuttle service, accessible taxis and vehicle rental are just some of the options available.

Vehicle Rental

Location Jean Légaré rents accessible vehicles complete with access ramps. Their minivans feature a side entrance and can accommodate up to three people in motorized wheelchairs, for a maximum total of five passengers. It is also possible to rent a vehicle with hand controls.

Accessible Transportation

Each municipality in Québec offers adapted transit to residents of the province. A user number is required to book transport. You may apply for a number if you are already using adapted transit in your municipality. Availability can vary across regions.
